### **Electoral Roll revision 2019**

Parishes in the Church of England are required to compile an electoral roll, and these have to be fully revised every six years – which happens this year. Being on the electoral roll entitles lay members to vote in the annual parochial church meeting but beyond this legal technicality it means far more than that. For individuals, being on the electoral roll is the nearest we have to being signed up as a member. It is also a requirement for anyone wishing to stand for the PCC. For individual churches the electoral roll is also a way of ensuring we have up to date details as well as provides a basis for reckoning the number of regular and committed worshippers. There is no catch; the roll is not publicly available other than to comply with the need for it to be completed and displayed for at least fifteen days ahead of the Annual Parochial Church Meeting in order to check for accuracy.

During the period of preparation of the roll, members on the previous roll need to apply to be included - inclusion is not automatic. The PCCs needs to ensure that reasonable efforts are made to let everyone on the old electoral roll know that a new one is being prepared and new people are especially encouraged to apply. The enrolment form will be available shortly.

## **Charlton Riverside News**

Following Greenwich Council having done an about turn last July in responded to community pressure to reject the initial developer's proposal for Charlton Riverside it was perhaps inevitable that the developers appealed and sought to take their plans to a higher level. As a result, the application was 'called in' by the Mayor of London. The developers application was heard at City Hall last Tuesday, accompanied by a lengthy report that supported the application. Despite a sense of resignation that the application would be rubber stamped, around 50 representatives of local community groups - including the Benefice of Charlton - were present.

The cases presented on behalf of the local groups were well organised and compelling. Much to collective delight the Mayor rejected the developers application. The words 'back to the drawing board' were for once welcome. This remarkable outcome was the result of an exceptional campaign by local community groups under the umbrella of Charlton Together and sets a precedent for community led regeneration in London, if not in the country as a whole. Justice in local housing is one of the goals of our Mission Action Plan. We are proud to be part of Charlton Together and can take pride in what we have helped to achieve. This is just the beginning.
