News from our PCC's

Hygiene in our churches

This statement from the Church of England has been read out in our churches for the last two weeks. Please be aware of its contents:

As you'll be aware, there has been much concern about the coronavirus since the start of this year. We want to reassure everyone that, at present, there is no Government advice that suggests the use of the Common Cup should be suspended. So we will continue to administer the wine from silver chalices.

However, it is best practice for churches to have hand-sanitisers available for use. You will find anti-bacterial soap in the toilets here.

We will also be following good practice guidelines that say priests presiding at the Eucharist, communion administrators and servers should use hand sanitiser before administration.

Members of the congregation with coughs and sneezes should refrain from handshaking during the peace. If you don't want to receive wine directly from the chalice, we ask that you receive in one kind only i.e. the bread. The practice of intinction (dipping) the wafer is not recommended (even by celebrants or communion-administrators) as it's a route by which infection can be transmitted.

These precautions are for the benefit of everyone and to protect the most vulnerable among us.

Rev'd Liz adds:

Hand washing is the most effective way to cut down the risk of transmitting viruses. We need to do so often, thoroughly and for the length of time recommended by the government (20 seconds, or the length of time it takes to sing 'Happy Birthday to you' twice!)

For the foreseeable future, we will not be sharing The Peace by shaking hands. We can of course share The Peace verbally and hope people will do so.

Donors who have already signed a 'lasting declaration' for Gift Aid

We're always grateful to have your donations but often miss out on Gift Aid due to lack of written information at the time of giving.

If you make a donation for any purpose (cheque or cash) and are a UK tax payer, please put your donation into an envelope and put the following information on the outside -

- Date
- Name and address
- Purpose of donation
- 'cash' or 'cheque'

Hand your donation into the vestry office after the service or to one of the wardens or Rector. This will enable us to collect Gift Aid owed to us.

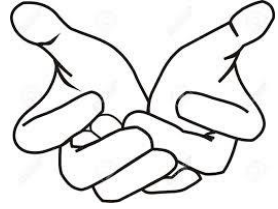
Safeguarding
